

# Fort gymnasts earning their medals

With the competitive season well under way, Fort Saskatchewan gymnasts are performing well and bringing back some medals.

Things began back in January at the St. Albert Winter Flip event and, since it was a full month earlier than Fort head coach Leanne Cameron was anticipating getting the girls into competition mode, they all did very well.

Kayla Sloman finished her division first in beam, floor

and uneven bars and second in vault.

Chantel Geislinger took first in all four events, garnering her first overall as well in the novice I category.

Carly Mak couldn't make the podium in the tyro I division, but did very well in such a large group of competitors.

In February, the gymnasts were back in St. Albert for the Dynamyx meet and Geislinger once again took top overall honours. She won gold in the floor, bars and beam, but had to settle for a bronze on the vault.

Victoria Moreau was the other local gymnast, who

was competing in her first meet. She was competing in the same division as Geislinger and won silver in both the vault and bars plus added a bronze in floor and placed fourth on the beam.

That would be good enough to win the overall bronze medal.

Last weekend was the Fort's last competition prior to a nearly two month break.

Geislinger and Moreau took part in the annual Mardi Gras Invitational in Sherwood

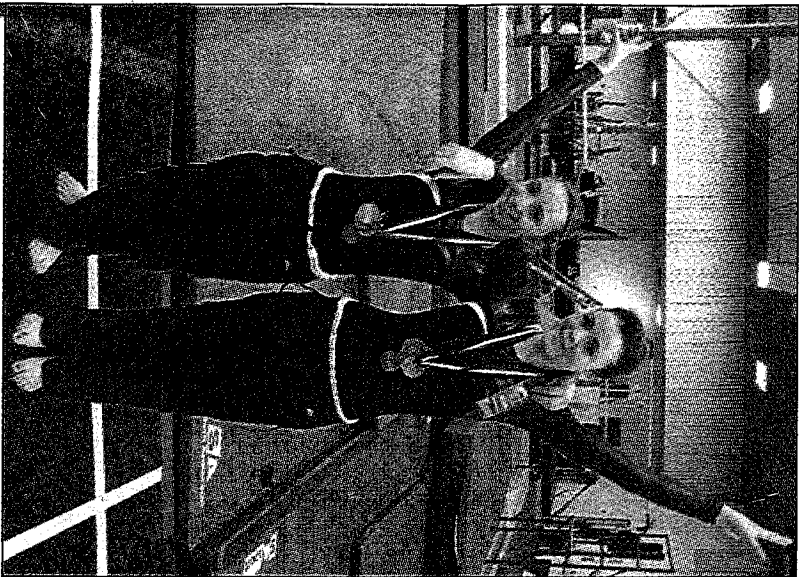
Park and did well at the toughest meet the club attends.

Geislinger captured gold on the bars as well as on the floor, but ended up fourth on vault and fifth on beam, which put her just a few points short of the top of the overall results, forcing her to settle for silver.

Moreau won silver on the vault and bronze on the beam after placing fourth on bars and sixth on floor.

So far Cameron is very pleased with how all of the girls have competed.
